Georgia Putnam Barrell

DOVER — Georgia Putnam Barrell, of 10 Loockerman Court, died of emphysema Thursday in Kent General Hospital, Dover. She was 61.

Mrs. Barrell was born in New York and was a graduate of the Rochester Business Institute. In 1946, she began service with the State Department. Her first assignment was as a secretary in Brussels and Antwerp, Belgium. After that, she was assigned to the American Consulate in Japan, then to the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo.

Soon afterwards, she was transferred to Saigon, Vietnam, where she worked in the personnel division of the U.S. Embassy. While in Saigon, she was promoted to the rank of foreign service officer, and was named the personnel officer for the U.S. Embassy in Saigon.

She returned to the United States in 1963, and moved to Lawton, Okla. While working for a legal firm there, she was elected president of the Oklahoma Legal Secretarial Association. She was the first legal secretary in Oklahoma to become qualified to represent clients as a layperson in that state's courts, though she never exercised the privilege, according to her family.

In 1969, she moved to Dover and managed the Lake Club Apartments before ill health forced her to retire in 1982.

She is survived by her husband, retired Army Col. Edgar A. III; a stepson, David S. of Wilmington; four stepdaughters, Samantha Weidemaier of Moore, Okla., Anne Vazquez and Kathy Filer, both of Lawton, and Susan Powell of Nobleboro, Maine; three sisters, Thelma Hughes of La Habre, Calif., Lucille Weber and Gladys Putnam, both of Rochester, N.Y.; and five grandchildren.

A Requiem Eucharist will be offered Monday at 11 a.m. at Christ Episcopal Church, State and Water streets. There will be no viewing. Burial will be in Christ Church Cemetery, Dover.
