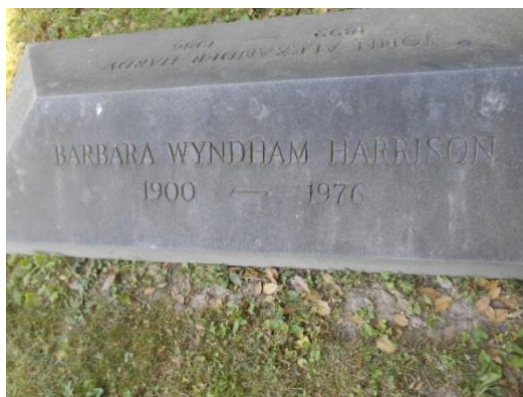

To Wed John Alexander Hardy.**

The engagement of Miss Barbara Wyndham Harrison to John Alexander Hardy, son of George F. Hardy of Whitestone, L. I., has just been announced by Miss Harrison's parents, Dr. and Mrs. D. A. Harrison, also of Whitestone.

Miss Harrison attended the Cathedral School of St. Mary's and was graduated from Smith College in 1923. Mr. Hardy attended Stuyvesant School, Warrenton, Va., and graduated from Dartmouth in 1922.

A large society wedding in Whitestone was held at Grace Episcopal Church, Whitestone, Saturday afternoon, when Miss Barbara Wyndham Harrison, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Daniel A. Harrison, of Waynemoore, Whitestone, and John Alexander Hardy son of George F. Hardy, of Cryder's Point, Whitestone, were married by the Rev. William Jenkins, B.D., rector.

Stewart Duncombe, organist of Grace Church, rendered a program of selections, including the wedding march from Lohengrin and Mendelssohn. The bride was given in marriage by her father, Dr. Harrison. A feature of the bride's costume was a pearl pin worn by fourteen brides in the family. Her dress was made from her mother's wedding dress. The bridesmaid was Miss Lucille Page, of Boston, Mass. Donald C. Griffin, of Manhattan, was best man and the ushers were Edward R. Harrison, a brother of the bride, John Griffin and Meric G. Arnold. A reception was held at the home of the bride's parents, at which over 200 guests were present.

The bride is a graduate of St. Mary's School, Garden City, and Smith College. The bridegroom is a graduate of Stuyvesant School, Virginia and Dartmouth Colleges.
