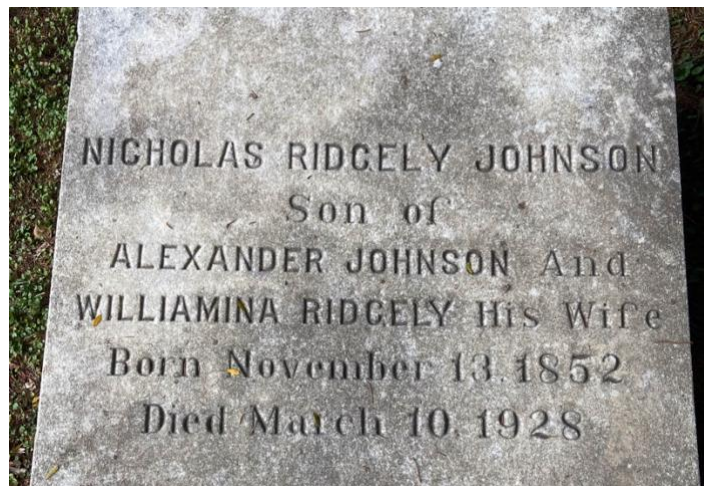

R. R. OFFICIALS AT JOHNSON FUNERAL

DOVER, Del., March 13.—The funeral of Colonel Nicholas R. Johnson, of Farmington, which took place yesterday noon at Christ P. E. Church this town, was largely attended. Most of the directors of the Delaware Railroad were present. The Rev. Benjamin Fish Thompson, rector of Christ Church, had charge of the services, interment being made in a vault in the Johnson lot adjoining the church.

The honorary pall-bearers were Chief Justice James Pennewill, former Governor S. S. Pennewill, D. M. Wilson, John C. Hopkins, Harry Mayer and Frank Hall Davis. The active pall bearers were friends of the deceased in and near Harrington and Farmington, J. Will Powell, Frank J. Prettyman, Arthur Lynch, George W. Johnson, Leonard Le Compt and John Cordray.
