Pennewill, of Dover, and Miss Katharine Ellison, daughter of William Ellison. The ceremony was performed by Rev. George M. Bond, the bride being given away by her father. She was robed in white satin trimmed in Duchesse lace and chiffon, and carried a bunch of Bride's roses and lilies-of-the-valley.

Miss Mabel Boothby, of Philadelphia, maid of honor, was dressed in light blue moire with liberty trimmings, carrying pink chrysanthemums. The best man was William Drein, of Wilmington, and the ushers were Robert V. Massey, of Baltimore; Emerson Seward, of Washington; George Bohem, of Philadelphia, and G. Gordon Massey, of Dover.
