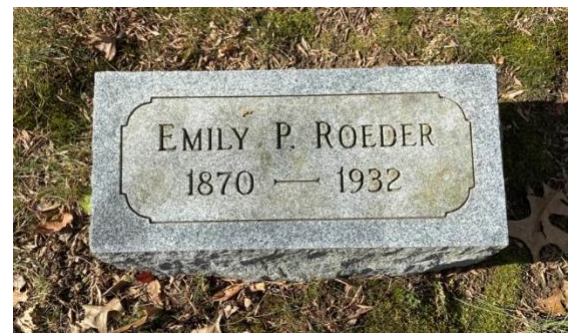
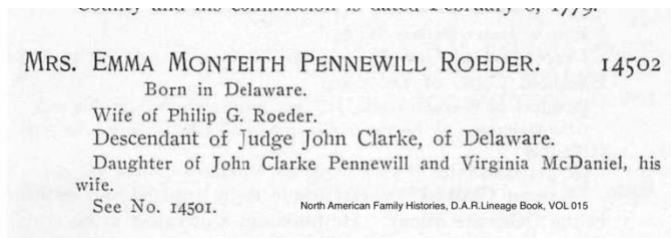

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:
 The Delaware State: To John Clarke, of the County of Kent, Esquire, residing: _____

Increase our President and General Assembly on the eighteenth day of January last by joint ballot did elect and appoint you, the said John Clarke, Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas and Orphans' Court for the said county of Kent.

Know you therefor that in pursuance of said appointment, we do by these presents commissionate you the said John Clarke, to be Chief Justice of the said Court of Common Pleas and Orphans' Court of and for the said county of Kent requiring you to do there that which is right and according to the law of the said State ought to be done and preformed. Witness his Excellency, Caesar Rodney, Esquire, President, Captain, General and Commander in Chief of the said State of Delaware the sixth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine.

In 1689 William Clarke, my great-great-great-great grandfather was granted a patent under the reign of James 2nd of two thousand acres of land and held a commission as first Surveyor General.
