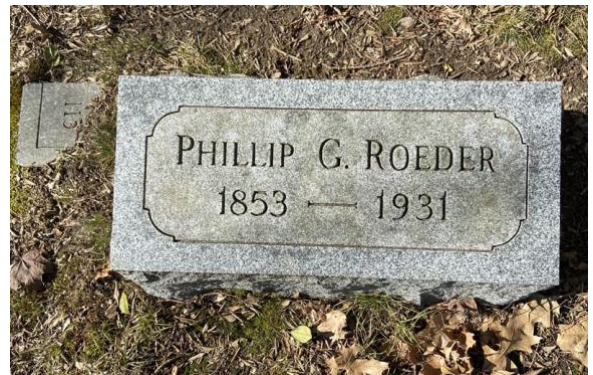

I was born at Cleveland, Ohio, U.S.A. on December 1st, 1853.
 My father, Chas. J. Rowder, born at Frankenthal, Germany, July 4, 1819, emigrated to the United States on or about 1850, and was temporarily, in the United States, from 1850 to 1858, was naturalized as a citizen of the United States before the Circuit Court of Cleveland, Ohio at Cleveland, Ohio on 1858.
 My date unknown.

I have resided outside the United States at the following places for the following periods:
 in Mexico from January 1891 to June 1910 as representative of American Manufacturers, with visits to U.S.A. in Cuba from Aug. 13/10 to present time.

My legal domicile is at Cleveland, Ohio my birthplace my permanent residence being at Havana, Cuba my temporary local address is Dulacra No. 72.

I desire to remain a citizen of the United States and intend to return thereto permanently to reside and perform the duties of citizenship within XXXX years, or when I am called to thereof.

Affidavit to Overcome Presumption of Expatiation.

[A naturalized citizen may overcome the presumption of expatriation by presenting satisfactory evidence establishing the following facts: (a) That his residence abroad is solely as a representative of American trade and commerce, and that he intends eventually to return to the United States permanently to reside; or, (b) that his residence abroad is in good faith for reasons of health or for education, and that he intends eventually to return to the United States to reside; or, (c) that some unforeseen and controlling agency beyond his power to foresee has prevented his carrying out a bona fide intention to return to the United States within the time limited by law, and that it is his intention to return and reside in the United States immediately upon the removal of the preventing cause.]

I, **Phillip Gothold Roeder**, a naturalized and loyal citizen of the United States, do solemnly swear that I last left my domicile in the United States at **Cleveland, Ohio**, on or about the **22nd** day of **January**, **1911**; that I have since resided temporarily at **Mexico City**; that I arrived in **Mexico City**, where I am now temporarily residing, on the **2nd** day of **February**, **1911**, my reasons for such residence being as follows: **I came to Mexico to introduce the Standard Sewing Machine Co. of Cleveland, Ohio, and after several trips to the U.S. I established my office here as agent of American machinery and supply houses—J. A. Fay & Egan Co., American Tool Works Co., Clark's Co. Manufacturers, Cummatt & Co., St. Louis, Mo., and am now residing here solely in representation of American manufacturers** and that I intend to return to the United States permanently to reside within **one** year or when **I have acquired a sufficient competence to enable me to support my family there**.
