William Henry Smith Of Dover, DE, died at home with his family on Sunday September 5, 1999. He was 81 years old.

Mr. Smith was born February 27, 1918 in Salem County, NJ to the late William H. and Mabel M. Smith. He served in the US Army, 390th Bombardment Group, and was honorably discharged in September 1945. Mr. Smith had been an active member of the Dover Kiwanis Club since 1970, and also served as Lt. Governor of the 7th Division from 1983 through 1984. He was employed by Henry B. Gilpin, a wholesale drug company, for 25 years until 1967. He then bought AAMCO Transmissions, which he owned and operated for 25 years.

He is survived by his wife of 53 years, Jewell (Judy) Smith; a daughter, Susan Novellino of Dover; a daughter, Linda Chambers of Aylesbury, England; a son, Anthony Smith who is serving in the US Navy in Norfolk, VA; and 7 grandchildren.

A Memorial Service will be held on Thursday, September 9 at 11 a.m. at Christ Episcopal Church, South State and Water Sts., Dover. Burial will be in Christ Church Cemetery at a later date.
