Funeral services were held in Christ Episcopal Church in Dover, Delaware on Monday, December 5, for Mrs. Ruth Hulett Steele, wife of E. Richmond Steele, who died on Friday in the Delaware Hospital in Wilmington.

The Rev. G. P. Mellick Belshaw, church rector, officiated, and burial was in the Christ Churchyard.

Mrs. Steele, the former Ruth Hulett, was born in Dorset, youngest daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Hulett, long time residents of Dorset, prior to their moving to Shaftsbury. She was a graduate of the Samaritan Hospital School of Nursing in Troy, N. Y., and served in the Army Nurse Corps during World War II in the African and European theatres.

Mrs. Steele was a member of the board of directors of the Kent General Hospital and was also on the board of directors of the Mapledale Country Club. She was an active member of Christ Episcopal Church and active in all civic circles.

Besides her husband, she is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Marian Spear of Shaftsbury and Mrs. Bliss A. Hulett of Arlington; an uncle, Howard Hulett of Pawlet, and two nieces, Mrs. Richard Wood of Arlington and Mrs. John Wilson of Penfield, N. Y.
