Mrs. Thompson was born Nov. 3, 1865, at "Stockwood," the family homestead near Catonsville, Md. The daughter of the late John T. and Mary Stockett, she was a descendant of early Maryland settlers.

A resident of Dover for 35 years, Mrs. Thompson was a member of the New Century Club here. She was active in affairs of Old Christ Church while her husband was rector there. He retired about 10 years ago.

In addition to her husband, she is survived by two sons, John Stockett Thompson and William Heyl Thompson, both of Philadelphia.
