Victim of Glider Crash To Be Buried at Dover

DOVER, Jan. 17—(Special).—Funeral services for Pvt. Townsend E. Tomlinson, 19, who was killed in a glider crash Friday, will take place-here Thursday.

Private Tomlinson was one of the 13 men who was to qualify for insignia at the Air Force Glider School at Fort Benning, Ga., and who were to make their final parachute jump preparatory to the completion of their training, that day.

The body arrived in Dover this t morning under military escort.

The services will be held Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock in Christ Church, with the Rev. Paul A. Kellogg, rector, officiating. Interment, with military honors in charge of Walter L. Fox Post No. 2, American Legion, will be in Christ Churchyard.

He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Townsend Tomlinson, with whom he resided at 440 West Water Street, prior to his enlistment last June; and two brothers, William and Everett Townsend, at the same address.
