C. THEODORE TREMAYNE, 91, of **Dover**, died Saturday of congestive heart failure in Kent General Hospital.

Mr. Tremayne was born in Ashley, Pa., and graduated from Wyoming Seminary, Kingston, Pa., and from the University of Pennsylvania with majors in retailing and accounting. In 1953, he moved to Dover, where he was an accountant for Lycoming Construction Co., Standard Bitulithic and James Julian Construction Co., for which he worked in Wilmington and Dover for many years. He retired in 1991.

He was an active member of Wyoming United Methodist Church. He enjoyed gardening.

His wife, Clara L. Tremayne, died in 1991. He is survived by two daughters, Lucy J. Durney and Dorothy C. Kelly, both of Dover; a sister, Florence T. Crump of Dallas, Pa.; four grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.
