Notes: Mary's mother Carrie, along with all her siblings were born and raised in Milford and are buried there as well. Carrie's father was a baker, (the son of German immigrants), and Carrie continued this occupation. The 1920 census shows her widowed, working as the proprietor of the Playa Hotel in Milford.

All censuses through 1930 show Mary continuing to live with her mother, working as a stenographer. There is no record of Mary in any 1940 census. By 1950 she is living in Dover with her teenage son Richard, as a lodger, unable to work.
