The petition of Miriam Elizabeth Susan Wall hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 511 Corinthian Avenue, Philadelphia, Pa.

Second. My occupation is Housewife

Third. I was born on the 18th day of June anno Domini 1887 at Liverpool, England

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Liverpool, England on the 10th day of December anno Domini 1919 and arrived in the United States, at the port of Philadelphia, on the 25th day of December anno Domini 1919 on the vessel Waverford.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 21st day of September anno Domini 1922 at Philadelphia in accordance with Act of September 22, 1922.

Sixth. I am single married. My [wife's] name is George [he] was born on the 24th day of June anno Domini 1888 at Philadelphia and now resides at 511 Corinthian Avenue, Philadelphia, Pa.

I have 2 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Germany and the British Commonwealth of Nations at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 20th day of September anno Domini 1919, and in the State of Pennsylvania, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 20th day of September anno Domini 1919 being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court.
