DOVER, June 25. — The wedding of Miss Nancy Terrell, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred W. Terrell, of Dover, to Lt. Harvey Raymond Wrede, Jr., of the U. S. Air Force, will take place Saturday at 4:30 p. m. in Christ Episcopal Church, Dover. A reception will be held in the gardens of the Terrell home, 519 Pennsylvania Avenue, in the state capital.

The bride-to-be is a graduate of Dover High School and attended the University of Delaware. Lieutenant Wrede, a graduate of Indiana University, is stationed at the Dover Air Force Base. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Raymond Wrede of Cloverdale, Ind.

Harvey R. Wrede Jr., founded garden center

DOVER — Harvey Raymond Wrede Jr., 64, founder of Dover's largest garden center-nursery and president of the state senior Olympics, died Wednesday of cancer at Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania.

Next year's state senior Olympics were recently named in his honor by Gov. Carper. The honor was announced at the games' annual banquet in Dover.

The Monticello, Ind., native joined the Air Force after his 1952 graduation from Indiana University, serving as a flight engineer. Shortly after becoming a second lieutenant in 1954, he was assigned to Dover Air Force Base.

He married in 1956 and joined his father-in-law, the late Fred Terrell, in his home-based Dover landscaping business. After his father-in-law's 1966 death, Mr. Wrede opened All Seasons Nursery and Garden Center, 1325 S. Governors Ave. The business grew into a full-service garden center featuring a wide, year-round selection of house plants.

His son and daughter now run it.

Mr. Wrede retired from the Air Force Reserve in 1982 as deputy maintenance commander, 512 Military Airlift Wing, Dover Air Base. He graduated from the Air War College in Alabama in 1977. While there, he earned a master's degree in business administration.

In 1991, he help found the state senior Olympics, reflecting his lifelong love of bicycling.

He was a vestryman at Christ Episcopal Church, Dover, president of Maple Dale Country Club, Dover, and the Dover post, Delaware Veterans of WW2. Survivors include his wife, Nancy T. Wrede; sons, Steven of Dover and Evan, a James Madison University senior; a daughter, Wendy Rezac of Dover; brothers, Bob of Monticello, Ind., and Roe of Cloverdale, Ind.; and three grandchildren.

A service was Saturday at Christ Episcopal Church, Dover. Instead of flowers, the family suggests contributions to Delaware Senior Olympics, Dover, or the church.
