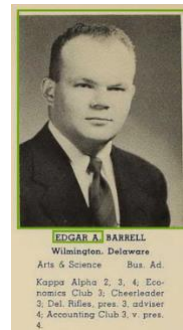

Edgar Barrell III, 56, decorated Vietnam vet

DOVER — Edgar A. Barrell III, a retired Army lieutenant colonel and Dover businessman, died Thursday of a heart attack in Hahnemann Hospital, Philadelphia, where he had been a patient for the last three weeks. He was 56.

Mr. Barrell, of 10 E. Loockerman Court, was born in Lansdowne, Pa. He was in the Army in Germany at the end of World War II. After his discharge, he attended Wesley College in Dover for a year, then transferred to the University of Delaware, where he graduated in 1952.

He rejoined the Army in the mid-1950s, serving in Germany and with NATO in Belgium. He served in the Korean and Vietnam wars, and was decorated for valor for his service in Vietnam.

While at Fort Sill, Okla., he married Georgia Putnam Barrell, a former U.S. State Department representative in Belgium and Saigon.

Mr. Barrell retired from the Army in the mid-1960s as a lieutenant colonel at Fort Sill.

He and his wife moved from Fort Sill to Dover, and for the next two years he was head of the Delaware's Community Affairs Department in Dover. At the time of his death, he was a representative and distributor for Conklin Company Distributors, a Dover chemical firm.

He ran for Dover City Council's 2nd District seat in 1974 and 1976 but was defeated by incumbent Francis R. Weyandt.

He was an active member of Christ Episcopal Church in Dover, where he was a licensed lay reader. He was a member of Dover Rotary Club, Central Delaware Chamber of Commerce and Community Singers Inc. in Dover. He performed in several of that group's plays.

He was the 1983 chairman for the American Cancer Society's auction committee in Dover.

Mrs. Barrell died in February. He is survived by a son, David S. of Wilmington; four daughters, Samantha Weidenmaier of Moore, Okla., Anne Vazquez and Kathi Filer, both of Lawton, Okla., and Susan Powell of Nobleboro, Maine; his father, Edgar Alden Barrell Jr. of Dover; a sister, Barbara Holly of Oklahoma City; a brother, Dorrance of Gainesville, Fla.; and six grandchildren.
