Mrs. Carolyn Hinkson Boyce, widow of James I. Boyce, a former Wilmington attorney, died yesterday morning in Delaware Hospital after an illness of about two months. Mrs. Boyce made her home at 1300 North Harrison Street.

A native of Chester, Mrs. Boyce had lived in this city 18 years. Her husband died in 1930. Surviving her are: Three children, William H. Boyce II, James I. Boyce, and Frederick H. Boyce, and a brother, Frederick R. Long, Swarthmore, Pa. Mrs. Boyce was a member of St. Andrew's P. E. Church and the Junior Board of Delaware Hospital.

Funeral services will be at 1:30 o'clock tomorrow afternoon in St. Andrew's Church with interment private at Dover.

Mrs. Carolyn Hinkson Boyce, former resident of this city, died yesterday in the Delaware Hospital, Wilmington, after an extended illness. She was stricken about two months ago and for a time rallied but last week her condition grew critical.

Mrs. Boyce, who resided at 1300 North Harrison street, was the daughter of Charles R. Long and Mrs. Hannah H. Hinkson Long and was a sister of Frederick R. Long, of the Chester Times. She is also survived by three sons, William H., James I. and Frederick H. She was active in the affairs of the Junior Board of the Delaware Hospital and was interested in other civic enterprises in Wilmington, where she took up her residence 18 years ago upon her marriage. Her deceased husband was James Boyce, prominent Delaware attorney.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Eighth and Shipley streets, Wilmington, Del. Interment will be private in Dover, Del.
