WASHINGTON, March 4. Miss Annie Fisher, daughter of Judge Fisher, First Auditor of the Treasury, and Benjamin Benson Cahoon, of Fredricktown, Mo., were married to-day at 2006 G street. Only a few friends were present with the family circle. The ceremony was performed in the deep alcove of the bay window of the drawing room, where an altar was erected. The space was curtained off by draperies of smilax falling from the projecting canopy, the corners filled in with palms and the altar decorated with annunciation lilies.

When the bridal party entered Rev. Father Gloyd, pastor of St. Stephen's Catholic Church, who performed the ceremony, was in

readiness. The groom and his best man, Mr. William H. Dennis, came in together, followed by the bride and her father.

The bride wore a traveling dress of light gray cloth, with steel and silver galloon trimming it. Her gloves matched in shade. Her hat was of gray crepe with a spray of wild heather on it. Her bouquet was of liles of the valley.

Mr. Cahoon is a well-known lawyer in his district and is a man of prominence in financial circles. After the ceremony and congratulations the company assembled to enjoy the wedding breakfast until the departure of Mr. and Mrs. Cahoon for their bridal tour.
