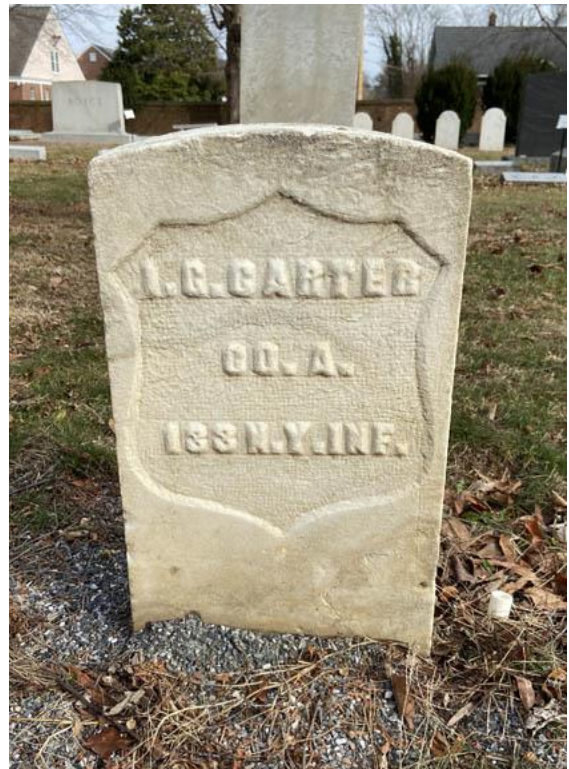

I, Ralph Meredith Hedger, am a lineal descendant of Corporal David Carter, who was born in Morristown, New Jersey on the 5th day of Oct. 1744, and died in Manorville, Long Island on the 2nd day of Jan. 1812, and who assisted in establishing American Independence.

Private and corporal in New Jersey militia and Continental Line.
 Private in Capt. Halsey's company, Eastern Battalion, Morristown, New Jersey militia.

Private in the 3rd company, Capt. Eschbach's 4th Battalion and Establishment, New Jersey Continental Line, December 30, 1776. Promoted to Corporal on this date and transferred to the 6th company, Capt. Alexander Mitchell's 1st Battalion, Second Establishment, February 1778. Served in the campaign against the Six Nations in Western Pennsylvania from May to November 1778 during the Revolutionary War. Data from Adjutant General's office, Trenton, N.J.
