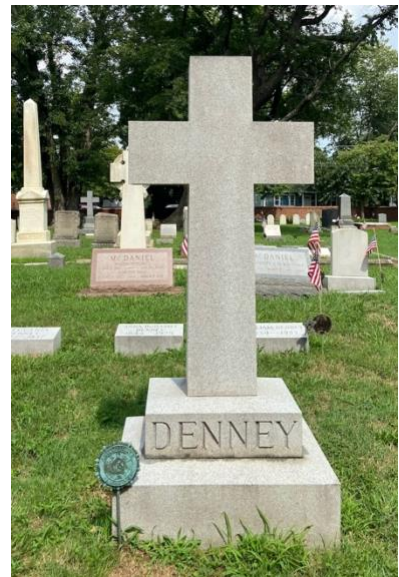

DOVER — Alice Godwin Denney, wife of former Delaware Gov. William du Hamel Denney, died Monday at her home at 201 William St. after a short illness. She was 91.

Her late husband, William D., a Republican, served as Governor from 1921 to 1925.

Mrs. Denney was the antiques editor for the New Delawarean magazine, which went out of business in 1940.

She is survived by two daughters, Anne Goodnow of Boulder, Colo., and June Wilson of Pittsford, N.Y., seven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Memorial services will be tomorrow morning at 11 at Christ Episcopal Church, South State and Water streets. Burial will be private. Instead of flowers, the family suggests contributions to Christ Episcopal Church, Dover, 19901.
