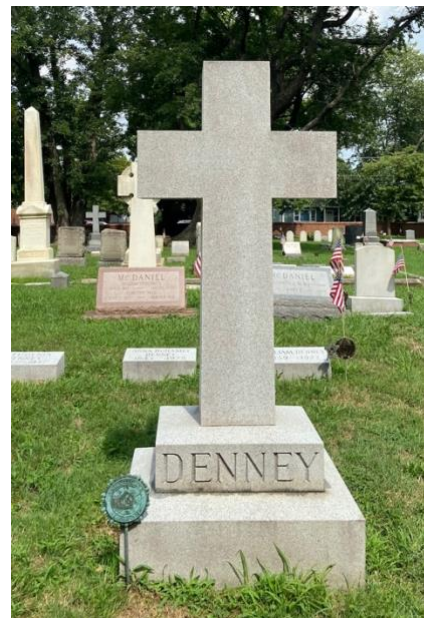
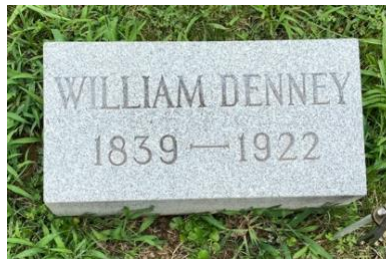

GOVERNOR'S FATHER DEAD

William Denney, aged 84 years, father of William Denney, Governor of Delaware, died at his home in Dover Monday. He was born between Smyrna and Leipsic and lived in that community until he moved to Dover, where he connected himself with the Kent Mutual Insurance Co., having served as secretary of that company from 1872 to 1921. Was senior warden of Christ P. E. Church many years. He is survived by his wife, one daughter, Miss Elizabeth Denney, and the governor. Governor Denney, who had gone to Washington, was summoned home.
