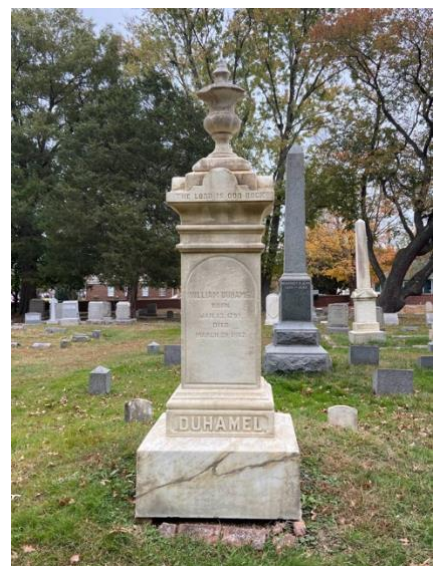

Know all Men by these Presents,

That we, *William Dehann & Samuel H. Fisher of the County & State of Delaware*

are held and firmly bound to the State of Delaware, in the sum of two hundred dollars, lawful money of said State, to be paid to the said State of Delaware; to which payment, well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves jointly and severally, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents.

31st day of March

in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and *twelve*

The Condition of the above written Obligation is, that

That if *William Dehann* and *Mary Pleasanton* may lawfully unite themselves in marriage, and there be no legal objection to celebrating the rights of marriage between them, then the said obligation shall be void, otherwise in force.
