Funeral services for G. Dan Enterline, 60, state auditor, who died Thursday morning, were held yesterday at Christ Episcopal Church, Dover. The Rev. Paul A. Kellogg, rector, conducted the services. Interment was in the church cemetery.

A native of Shamokin, Pa., Mr. Enterline received his education there and at the Pennsylvania State College School of Agriculture.

In 1931 he came to Dover and ran a livestock feed brokerage business. He had been a member of the Board of Education of the Dover Special School District since 1941, and president since 1947. He was first elected state auditor in 1950 for a two-year term, and in 1952 was returned to that office for another two years.

He is survived by his wife, the former Eleanor Brennan; a son, G. Dan Enterline Jr., a senior at the University of Delaware, and a sister, Mrs. M. J. Konstan, of Los Altos, Calif.

State Auditor Dies Suddenly From Heart Attack; Was Active in Delaware GOP

Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 10 a. m. at Christ Episcopal Church, Dover, for State Auditor G. Dan Enterline, 60, who died at 7:30 a. m. yesterday at Kent General Hospital, following a heart attack suffered earlier at his home.

The Rev. Paul A. Kellogg, rector, will officiate. Interment will be in the adjoining churchyard.

Members of the vestry of Christ Church will serve as the pallbearers.

Church by sending such contributions to the Rev. Paul A. Kellogg rector.

Mr. Enterline, who had suffered from a heart condition for many years, was stricken at his home No. 20 Maple Lane, Dover, at 3 a. m. and was rushed to the hospital. He had been confined to his home under a physician's care for the past few days.

Informed of his death, Gov. J. Caleb Boggs said:

"I was shocked and deeply-distressed to learn of the untimely passing of such an able, conscientious and outstanding public servant.

"As state auditor, he had been untiring in efforts to conduct his public trust with the very highest standards. He was a good friend and an outstanding citizen of the state of Delaware, whose loss will be felt by all.

"My deepest sympathies are with his widow and son at this time of their great bereavement, and I have asked that all state agencies will display their flags at half-mast until after his funeral, out of respect for this fine public official."

The Governor said Deputy Auditor T. Edgar Townsend, Jr., of Wyoming, will be acting auditor until he appoints a successor to Mr. Enterline.

Throughout his life, Mr. Enterline, a Republican, had preferred "Dan" to "Daniel" in his formal signature. He was first elected auditor in 1950 for a two-year term. In 1952, he was reelected to that office for another two years. In his first election test, his opponent was James W. W. Baker. Two years later, he defeated Clifford E. Hall.

Born in Shamokin, Pa., Nov. 19, 1893, he was the son of the late Dr. John H. and Eleanor Green Enterline. He graduated from Shamokin High School, and, in 1915, was awarded a degree from the school of agriculture of Pennsylvania State College.

Mr. Enterline came to Dover in 1931, and operated a feed brokerage business, representing the manufacturers to dealers of the Delmarva Peninsula.

He had been a member of the Board of Education of the Dover Special School District since 1941, and president since 1947.

He was a member and former vestryman of Christ Episcopal Church, Dover, and a member and past president of the Dover Kiwanis Club. He was also past grand exalted ruler of the Elks Lodge in Shamokin.

He is survived by his wife, the former Elenor Brennan; a son, G. Dan Enterline, Jr., a senior at the University of Delaware, and a sister, Mrs. M. J. Konstan, of Los Altos, Calif.
