## SUDDEN DEATH.

The death of Harry J. B. Ford orcurred Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the family residence on Pear street in the Seventh ward. was due to Bright's disease. The deceased was seemingly in the best of health Monday and attended to his work. By occupation he was a painter and paperhanger. He was 41 years old. A mother, three sisters and a brother survive. The mother, Mrs. Sarah A. Ford, and the three sisters. Misses Amy, Ellla and Leta Ford, reside at the family home, and the brother, Charles Ford, lives in Kalamazoo. Mich.
