DOVER, Sept. 8—(Special).—Funeral services for Miss Lucy Gibson, 82, will be held at Christ Church at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon with the Rev. Paul A. Kellogg, rector of the church, officiating. Interment will be in Christ churchyard.

Miss Gibson, who died yesterday in the Kent General Hospital, was the daughter of the late Rev. Lewis W. Gibson, who many years ago was rector of Christ Church, and Mary Donnell Gibson.

ay Miss Lucy Gibson, City Native, Dies

Miss Lucy Gibson, native of Sunbury and for many years a resident of Dover, Delaware, died Thursday, October 6 at Dover from infirmities. She was 82 years of age.

She was the daughter of Rev. Lewis Gibson and Mary Donnell Gibson, now deceased. Her father was rector of Christ Episcopal Church, Dover, for 30 years. Her mother was a daughter of Hon. and Mrs. Charles G. Donnell of Sunbury, the former having served as judge of the county courts before the Civil War.

In her youth Miss Gibson and her sister Miss Polly Gibson spent much of their time with their aunts, Misses Elizabeth and Frances Donnell, whose home was in the Colonial residence adjoining the present Sunbury Daily Item office on Market Square. The Donnell family a century ago was one of the most active in St. Matthew's Episcopal parish.
