EMILY N. HART, 78, of Woods Edge Road, **Dover**, died Sunday of heart failure at home.

Mrs. Hart had worked for the Delaware Department of Public Instruction, where she taught homebound children. She later taught children with learning disabilities for the Caesar Rodney School District. She retired in 1974.

She was a hostess at Woodburn, the governor's residence in Dover, and recently completed a book on the mansion. Family members said this week they will continue plans to publish the book.

She was a member of Christ Episcopal Church, Dover.

Her husband, Floyd T., died in 1987. She is survived by two daughters, Nancy Palmer Hart, at home and Suzanne Hart Biter of Boulder, Colo.; two sisters, Helen Hutchison of West Chester, Pa., and Mary Kay Boal of Oil City, Pa., and three grandchildren.

Memorial services will be at 3 p.m. Saturday in Christ Episcopal Church, Water Street, Dover. Burial will be private.
