Navy Veteran, Recruit Sign Up for Duty

William Francis Fallers, 26, of 2707 Madison Street, and Harry Maag Hayes, 18, of 35 North Governors Avenue, Dover, were enlisted in the Navy today by Chief Petty Officer Dale S. Norton.

Fallers, who served three years in the Navy in World War II, enlisted for three years as a seaman. He will report to the Philadelphia Navy receiving station for assignment to Hayes, a graduate of Dover High School, enlisted as an airman recruit and will go to Great Lakes, Ill., Naval training station.
