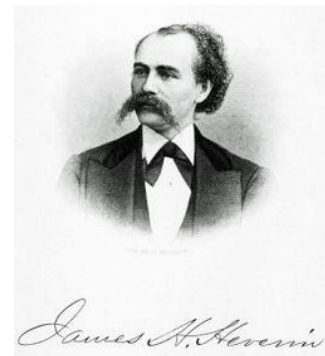

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, *James H. Heverin and John L. Pratt* are held and firmly bound to the State of Delaware, in the sum of TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS, lawful money of the said State, to be paid to the said State of Delaware; to which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, and each of us, jointly and severally, our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this *Eleventh* day of *June* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-*six*.

The Condition of the above written Obligation is such, That if *James H. Heverin* aforesaid and *John L. Pratt* *M. Ada Kator* may lawfully unite themselves in marriage, and if there be no legal objection to celebrating the rites of marriage between them, then this obligation shall be void; otherwise, to be and remain in force.

FUNERAL OF MR. HEVERIN.

The Remains Taken to Dover, Delaware, for Burial.

The funeral services of James H. Heverin were held at noon yesterday at 1808 De Lancey place, his late residence. There were many floral tributes, the most conspicuous being a large four-leaf clover made of violets, the gift of the Clover Club.

Rev. Dr. S. E. Appleton, of Protestant Episcopal Church of the Mediator, conducted the services, and the pall-bearers were General H. H. Bingham, William M. Bunn, Henry Mines, James H. Shakespeare, Frank McLaughlin, George W. Arundel, Hon. Thomas R. Elcock, Lewis N. Megargee and George W. Fairman.

The body was taken to Dover, Delaware, for interment.

Hammond** and **Snively,** the former a **Baltimore lawyer,** and the latter a **New Yorker.** In accordance with modern custom there will be no bridesmaids. The bride will enter the church on the arm of her brother, **James H. Heverin, Esq.**
