Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore an ivory peau de soie gown and train with seed pearl trim. A crown of beaded Alencon lace held her silk illusion veil, and she carried stephanotis and phalaenopsis orchids.

Miss Marilyn Elkin of St. John, New Brunswick, Canada, was maid of honor. Bridesmaids were Miss Elizabeth Schmalhofer of Rehoboth, Miss Rebecca Reed of Dover, Miss Susan Weems of Ashland, Va., and Miss Carol Miller of Winnetka, Ill.
