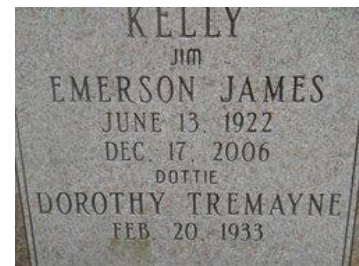

The Rev. Dr. William Trader, pastor, officiated at the double ring ceremony.

The bride, who was given in marriage by her father, wore a regal type gown, fashioned with high neck, long tight pointed sleeves of Chantilly lace, with a full skirt of net and lace over nylon tulle. Her fingertip length veil of illusion, fell from a crown of sequins and seeded pearls. She carried a cascade bouquet of white roses and baby's breath.
