Canon Costin retires; interim rector accepted

BENNINGTON — The Rev. Driss Richard Knickerbocker has responded to a call from St. Peter's Church to come as interim rector while the parish continues its self-study program and then instigates a search for a permanent rector.

Father Knickerbocker has most

Father Knickerbocker has most recently been the interim rector of St. Paul's Cathedral in Burlington where he has carried on the duties of the dean of the cathedral. He has had a varied career having served as interim rector in three towns in Michigan and one in Maryland. He has served as assistant minister and curate in churches in and around

London, England as well as doing a stint as master at St. Paul's School in Concord, Mass.

Early in his ministry, Father Knickerbocker was in Seattle, Wash., and has served in churches in Malta, Morocco and Ontario, Canada. He has been a computer consultant in London and a maitre d' in Maryland. St. Peter's will welcome a man with his experience to carry on while seeking a replacement for Father Costin.

Canon Kenneth Costin, who has been rector at St. Peter's for 18 years, will conduct his last service on Nov. 17. The parish will be there in force to say farewell to the man who has left his mark on the Bennington community as well as the church. Canon Costin has been a prime mover in affordable housing, food and fuel fund, ecumenicism, religious education, and many other local concerns. He has also worked closely with two bishops in the Vermont Diocese.

His departure in November will be a sad occasion for St. Peter's. His many friends and fellow ministers will have an opportunity to greet him at a reception which is planned for November.
