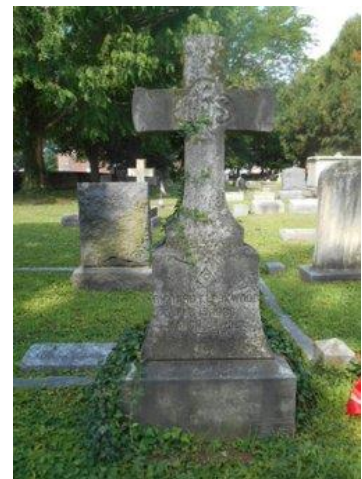

St. Michaels.—Richard J. Lockwood, 75 years old, died here Tuesday after a lingering illness from a complication of diseases. He removed here about 15 years ago from Delaware. He is survived by a widow. Funeral services will be held Wednesday at Christ Protestant Episcopal Church, of which Mr. Lockwood was a vestryman. Rev. J. F. Kirk, the rector, will officiate. The services will be in charge of the Masonic Lodge, of which Mr. Lockwood was a member. The body will be taken to Dover, Del., for burial.
