## William I. N. Lofland

DOVER, Jan. 10—(Special).—Funeral services for William I. N. Lofland, an employe of the Capital Trust Company of Delaware here for about 35 years, were held this afternoon at Christ Church with the Rev. Paul A. Kellogg, rector, officiating. Interment was in Christ Churchyard.

Mr. Lofland's duties sent him on daily trips to the state corporation department offices and other public offices and his name had appeared as an incorporator on hundreds of charters filed by the Capital Trust Company. He had become a familiar figure to a vast number of persons here over the years as he took his business walks to and from the various offices.

About 84 years of age, he had lived alone in his home, 24 North Street, since the death of his sister, Miss Mary E. Lofland, several years ago. It was there that he died unexpectedly Friday afternoon. In an unobtrusive way, he always had a word of greeting for passersby whom he knew, mixing it with a comment on the weather. He was unmarried.

In his early years, he worked for a livery stable in Milton and later was employed by a grocery store here before being employed by the Capital Trust Company of Delaware, located on The Green. And in those years he had become 'akin to a landmark over his daily route.
