FUNERAL ON THURSDAY FOR ALBERT MAAG, JR.

DOVER, May 24—(Special).—Funeral services for Albert Maag Jr., 51, who died this morning, will be held at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon from his home in Eastover Hills with interment in Christ Churchyard. The Rev. Paul A. Kellogg, rector of Christ Church, will officiate.

Mr. Maag, familiarly known as "Huntzy" from his keen activity in hunting dog circles, had been ailing for sometime and died at his home following a heart attack. He conducted a store dealing in sporting goods and other merchandise in Lookerman Street the past 25 years and was secretary of the Kent County Field Trial Association.

He was a member of Union Lodge, No 7, A. F. and A. M., and, a veteran of World War I, was a past commander of Walter L. Fox Post, No 2, American Legion, for which he also served as finance officer a number of years.

It was his custom each year to play host at a party for dog men coming here for field trials, in connection with which he was widely known throughout the state.

Mr Maag is survived by his wife, Mrs Helen Smithers Maag; two brothers, Harry and Frank Maag, and five sisters, Miss Elizabeth Maag, Miss Lucy Maag, Miss Helen Maag, Mrs. Carrie M. Hayes, and Mrs. Anna Knight, all of Dover.

Albert Maag of Dover Dies of Heart Attack

DOVER, May 24—(Special).—Albert Maag, 50, a Dover merchant, and widely known in hunting-dog circles, died about 10:30 o'clock this morning, at his home in Eastover Hills. He had been in ill health for some time, and early this morning suffered a heart attack from which he never rallied.

Mr. Maag operated a store on Lockerman Street, dealing in sporting goods and other merchandise for the past 25 years. Every year he was host to dog fanciers when they gathered here for field meets.

A veteran of World War I, he was a post commander of Walter L. Fox Post No. 2, American Legion, and for many years served as the post finance officer. He was also a member of Union Lodge, No. 7, A. F. and A. M.

Mr. Maag is survived by his wife, Mrs. Helen Maag; two brothers, Frank and Harry Maag, and five sisters, Miss Elizabeth Maag, Miss Lucy Maag, Mrs. Ralph Hayes, Mrs. Anna Knight, and Miss Helen Maag, all of Dover.
