KIDDIES TRAVEL ALONE FROM CAL.

Unaccompanied. Dean O'Bryne Lloyd, aged 11, and Lee Lloyd, aged 9, brothers of Hugo, Colo., arrived at the Pennsylvania Railroad station here yesterday afternoon and they were met by Mrs. Roberta C. Williams of the Travelers Aid Society and placed on a Delmarva Division train for Hartley, where they were met by their grand mother, Dr. Ada H. MacAlpine.

The Travelers' Aid branch telegraphed the news of their safe arrival in Hartley to their parents in Hugo. Because of the ill health of their father, the boys were sent East to live with their grandmother. When they arrived here yesterday each wore blue overalls and a wide brimmed straw hat. They reported that they had enjoyed their 2,000-mile journey alone and hadn't cried a bit.

Each youth had a tag on which was written his name, age, where he was from and where he was going. Dean is in the seventh grade of school and Lee the fifth.

The boys are the sons of Mrs. Ada Mac Alpine Lloyd Hugo Tues. July 14, Evening Journal, Wilmington, DE Tues.

Ada Lorenza Lorena (Detrick) Hutchinson, d/o of Wm and Helen Mar (Hutchinson) Detrick was born Mar 22, 1859 in Walsingham Norfolk Co. Canada. At an early age Ada's parents died and was adapted by her grandparents, Major Alexander B. and Phoebe (Price) Hutchinson. Ada thereafter used the Hutchinson name. On Oct 24, 1878 she married Dr. William MacAlpine. Ada was a beautiful and domineering woman who height was bearly 5'. She studied medicine at Johns Hopkins. She lived in Hartley, DE and mostly lived seperated from William. Ada Died in June of 1944 and is buried in Dover, DE in the church yard of Christ Church next to William.
