DOVER, Del., Aug. 20—(Special). —Announcement has been made by Mr. and Mrs. John C. Hayes of the marriage on Aug. 3 of their daughter, Miss Dorothy M. Hayes of Dover, to Mr. Wilmer E. McCorquodale, Jr., of Philadelphia and Orange, Texas.

The bride is a member of the faculty of the Claymont High School, and was graduated with the degree of bachelor of arts from the University of Delaware in 1930. She received the degree of master of arts in English from the University of Pennsylvania this year. While in college she was a member of the social committee and the French Club.

Mr. McCorquodale was graduated from Texas A. & M., and is a chemical engineer with the Sun Oil Co. at Marcus Hook. The couple are on an extended trip through the South, their destination being the home of his parents in Orange. Upon their return they will live at 4031 Walnut Street, Philadelphia.

DOROTHY HAYES MCDANIEL, 80, Courtland Manor, Dover, died there Saturday of heart failure.

Mrs. McDaniel, who formerly resided in Arden, near Wilmington, was a high school English teacher and counselor for more than 20 years. She taught at Claymont High School in the 1930s and Mount Pleasant High and Stanton Junior High schools in the late 1950s and 1960s.

She was a graduate of the University of Delaware and received a master's degree in literature from the University of Pennsylvania.

She was chairman of Wilmington Garden Day and in 1956 was in charge of the first Delaware Engagement Calendar, which was associated with Garden Day and St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.

She was the first woman in Delaware to become a Life Master of the American Contract Bridge League. She was author of a bridge column, "Hit the Deck" which appeared in the Journal-Every Evening newspapers in the late 1940s. She was a former handicap chairwoman of Garrison's Lake Golf Club, Smyrna.

Her other hobbies included playing the organ and needlepoint.

Her husband, Dr. J. Stites McDaniel Jr., died in 1987. She is survived by a son, David A. McCorquodale of Wilmington; a daughter, Priscilla Mack of Columbia, S.C.; a stepson, Joseph S. McDaniel III of Dover; two stepdaughters, Melinda Jane Palmer of Dover and Charlotte Ann Gustavson of Georgetown, Mass.; a brother, William A. Hayes of Dover; five grandchildren and five stepgrandchildren.

Memorial services will be Thursday at 1 p.m. in Christ Episcopal Church, South State and Water streets, Dover. There will be no viewing.
