Elizabeth F. McGowan, 92, of Tempe Arizona, passed away peacefully on December 10, 2000. She had lived in this area since her move from Dover, Delaware, in 1990. She was born in Belfast, Northern Ireland, on November 8, 1908, and immigrated with her family to Massachusetts as a small child. She graduated from the High School of Practical Arts in Boston and received nurse's training at the New England Deaconess Hospital, graduating as a registered nurse. Liz worked primarily as a private duty nurse until she volunteered for the Army Nurse Corps following the outbreak of WWII. She served throughout the war, primarily in hospitals in England. After the war, she married Thomas McGowan and devoted herself to her family working as a nurse part-time until her retirement in 1973. Liz was a life-long member of the Episcopal Church and a devoted family member and caring friend. She is survived by her son, Thomas, and his wife, Meredith, of Tempe; her grandchildren, Claire and Andrew; and her sisters, Edith, Ruth, and Alice. A memorial service will be held December 14th at 1pm at Church of the Epiphany, Tempe. She will be buried at Christ Church Cemetery in Dover, Delaware, on December 16th.
