DOVER — George A. McPhee, died Monday, March 20, 2006, after a five-year battle with melanoma. He was 76.

He was born March 19, 1930, in Dorchester, Mass., son of the late George O and Ellen C (Stewart) McPhee.

Mr. McPhee graduated from Milton High School in Massachusetts and Bentley School of Accounting and Finance, Boston.

He served in the U.S. Marine Corps for six years.

Mr. McPhee came to Dover with General Foods from Walter Baker Chocolate Co., in Dorchester, in 1963, having worked for one year in White Plains, N.Y. on the Dover Task Force. He retired from General Foods as office services supervisor on April 1, 1986, after 33½ years of service.

His main hobby was his many Masonic affiliations. He was a member and past master of Union Lodge 7, AF&AM, Dover; a member of Delaware Consistory, Wilmington; past potentate, Nur Shrine, Wilmington; past president of Patrol Unit; past president of Mid-Atlantic Association of Shrine Patrols and current treasurer.

He was a past leader of the York Rite Bodies in Dover; past worthy patron, Victory Chapter 15, Order of Easter Star, Dover; past worthy grand patron, Grand Chapter of Delaware, OES; life member and past commander, Delaware Veterans of World War II, Post 2, Dover; life member American Legion Post 2 Dover; life member Disabled American Veterans, Camden; life Member and past commandant Central Delaware Detachment, Marine Corps League; past commandant Department of Delaware Marine Corps League; member of Pound 237 Military Order of Devil Dogs, Marine Corps League; past director, Delaware Court 64, Royal Order of Jesters; and member of Delaware Preceptory, DeMolay Legion of Honor; Modern Maturity Center, Dover; and St. Peter's Episcopal Church, Smyrna.

Mr. McPhee was a loyal fan of the Boston Red Sox and the New England Patriots.

He is survived by his high school sweetheart and wife of 54 years Pauline (Rauscher) McPhee; three sons and three daughters-in-law, Stephen G. and Cheree of Newark, Douglas P. and Jen of Woodbine, Ga. and Jeffrey S. and Paula of Hampton, Va.; two daughters and two son-in-law, Sheryl and Mark Smith of Gloucester, Mass., and Susan and David Shelor of Magnolia; a sister, Sandra Fly of Charlotte, N.C.; seven granddaughters, Megan, Stephanie, Katie, Colleen, Casey, Kara, and Diana; four grandsons, Britt, Kyle, Ian and Matt; his Tuesday and Friday morning coffee buddies at Spence's Bazaar; and Nellie, his 4-year-old boxer.
