DOVER — Edgar W. Montell, 87, of Crescent Farm Nursing Home, formerly of Country Club Apartments, Dover, died of heart failure Thursday in Kent General Hospital.

Mr. Montell retired in 1965 as a field representative for Campbell Soup Co., Camden, N.J. He had worked for the company for 40 years. He operated a farm in Millington, Md., for 11 years after he retired.

He is survived by his wife, Helen Horsey Montell, of the Crescent Farm Nursing Home.
