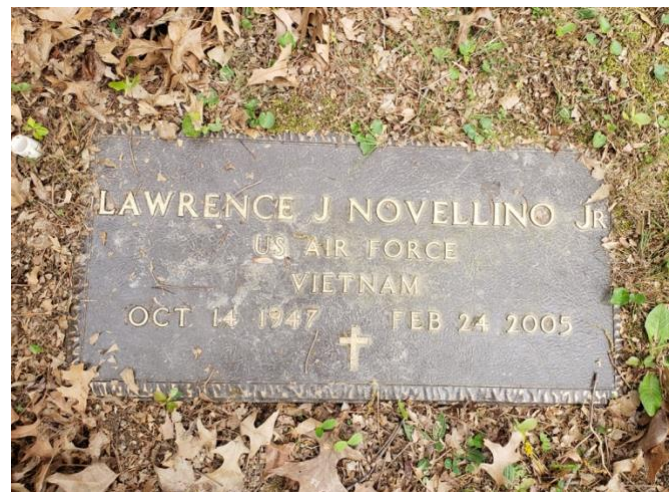

Lawrence J. "Skip" Novellino, 57, of Dover, Del., formerly of Old Bridge, died Thursday, Feb. 25, 2005, at home.

He lived in Old Bridge and then moved to Jackson, N.J., in 1972.

He was an Air Force veteran of the Vietnam War and a Purple Heart recipient. He moved to Delaware in 1986. He attended Christ Episcopal Church of Dover. He was a member of the Disabled American Veterans, the Walter L. Fox American Legion Post 2 and the Kiwanis Club, all of Dover, and had volunteered with the Boy Scouts of America.

He was predeceased by his mother, Marie R. Novellino, and his father, Lawrence J. Novellino Sr. He is survived by his wife of 33 years, Susan Smith Novellino; a son, James J. Novellino of Dover; a daughter, Aimee Carter and her husband, Jerry, of Milton, Del.; two brothers, Nicholas V. Novellino of Toms River and Joseph Novellino of Asheville, N.C.; a sister, Roxanne Simon of West Palm Beach, Fla. Also surviving are three grandchildren, Cole Phoenix Carter, Jerry Lee Carter, and Elizabeth Ann Carter.
