She and Bob traveled to Quebec for their honeymoon, and traveled by train later in their lives across Canada from Montreal to Vancouver. Margaret did not like to fly due to an inner ear problem from an issue with an unpressurized plane cabin when she was young. Doris Saunders, who hosted a wedding shower for Margaret was her matron of honor. They have been friends for over 70 years, and still chat with each other every evening. Doris and her husband Owen were lifelong friends of Bob and Margaret, as were Cleve and artist Hasting.

Margaret stayed home with their 2 infant daughters, and taught for a while at the Little School, where their children had attended. She eventually taught Child Care (early childhood development) at the Kent Co. Vocational School before it became Polytech. Her 2 daughters attended school away from home, and both went to Goucher College in Baltimore, MD.

Jean Webb *Osbourne* Simons, who lives in Illinois, has 2 daughters, and Leslie *Osbourne* McKernan of Texas, 4 years younger, has 2 boys. (Leslie and her husband will be buried next to their parents in 110 G + H.)

Margaret told me that their original burial spaces were in lot 55 next to the Richardsons (Lot 66). But in 1965 Henry Horsey insisted that those spaces belonged to him, and the Osbournes had to give them up. So Rev. Mellick Belshaw gave them 5 spaces that had recently been mapped out close to the church near the Caesar Rodney Monument (Lot 110 F-J). Then in the early 2000's Rev. Driss Knickerbocker (who had been an interim priest at Christ Church) asked if he could have space F to put his marker, as there was not enough room in 109 J, where his partner George Brown was already buried. So the Osbournes have ended up with spaces G,H, I, and J in Lot 110.

(Henry Horsey buried his aunt and uncle from Easton, MD in Lot 55, A + B (Heisler and Edith Harrington). That family buried the Harrington's son-in-law, John Mauldin Watkins, in 55 E on April 28, 2021. They intend to bury his wife in D, and her sister in C.)

As Margaret's eyesight began failing, she decided to move from a cottage into assisted living at Westminster in Dover, where she can receive help in daily living and enjoy the company of others. She has not been able to attend Christ Church, where she is a part of the 8:00 service. The COVID-19 virus brought many restrictions. She does listen to services on TV, and attends services at Westminster when there is a chaplain available.

Margaret Osborne Obituary

Margaret Webb Osborne, age 97, of Dover, passed away on February 4, 2024. She was born July 4, 1926, to Lucius C. and Alice Robbins Webb of Milford, Delaware. After graduating Milford High School in 1944, Margaret earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Home Economics from the University of Delaware in 1948. She then served for five years as Kent County 4-H Club Agent for the Delaware Agricultural Extension Service. In 1952 she married Robert E. Osborne, Jr. They enjoyed fifty-five years together.

Margaret later taught kindergarten at the Little School, Dover, from 1962 to 1971, where she introduced and taught the Phonovisual Method of reading. From 1971 to 1981, she taught childcare at Kent County Vocational-Technical School (now Poly-Tech), Woodside. During this time, she served on the Advisory Committee to the Department of Home Economics at Delaware State College (now DSU) and on the Governor's Advisory Council for Education of Exceptional Children. After retirement in 1981, Margaret organized the volunteer program for the Dover Blood Bank. She was a member of Master Beta Chapter of Beta Sigma Phi Sorority, Milford.

Margaret was a member of Christ Episcopal Church, Dover, where she served as President of the Women of Christ Church, member of the Altar Guild, Needlepoint Guild, Sunday school teacher, and youth advisor.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was predeceased by her sisters, Kathryn I. Webb and Orpha W. Ashton (Grover), and brother, L. Robbins Webb, all of Milford.

She is survived by her two daughters, Jean O. Simons (Howard) of Glenview, Illinois, and Leslie O. McKernan (Stephen) of League City, Texas, two grandsons, A. Levi Simons (Stacie) of Los Angeles, California, and Samuel Z. Simons (Erica) of Sheboygan Falls, Wisconsin, two granddaughters, Stephanie G. McKernan and Jennifer A. McKernan, both of Houston, Texas, a great-granddaughter, Eva Roseleigh Simons of Sheboygan Falls, Wisconsin, a sister-in-law, Kathryn D. Webb of Milford, and many nieces and nephews.
