MRS. MARY H. SAULSBURY SUCCUMBS AT DOVER

DOVER, Nov. 28.—Mrs. Mary Hayes Saulsbury, 82 years old, widow of John Ponder Saulsbury, and daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Manlove Carmalt Hayes, died at her home here tonight after a long illness due to complications. Funeral services will be held from her late home on Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock with interment in the Christ Church burying ground.

Mrs. Saulsbury's father was secretary and treasurer of the Delaware Railroad when it was first started many years ago and her husband was a son of the former Chancellor Willard Saulsbury. She was active in Red Cross work, the Century Club and affairs of the Episcopal Church. She is survived by one sister, Miss Anna Hayes.
