DOVER, Del., July 26.—Dr. Carl B. Scull, Jr., president of the Delaware State Medical Society, died at his home here yesterday of a heart ailment. He was 47.

Dr. Scull, who was born in Wyoming, Del., was a 1928 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania Medical School. He served with the Delaware National Guard from 1930 to 1939 and was with the Army from 1942 to 1946, serving in both the African and Italian campaigns. Before and after the war he served on the Kent county Selective Service Board.

He was a Mason and a member of the Maple Dale Country Club here. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Sara Scull, and two daughters, Amelia and Rebecca.

FUNERAL SERVICES HELD FOR DR. CARL SCULL, JR.

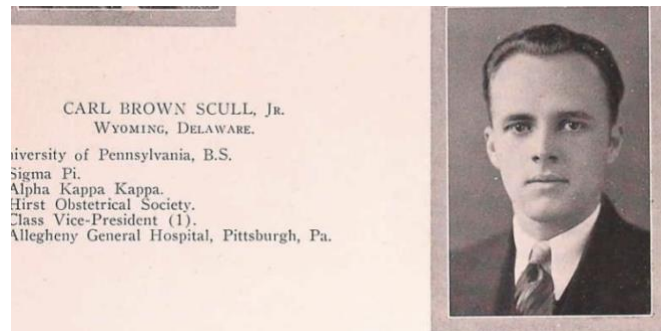
DOVER, July 28—(Special).—Funeral services for Dr. Carl B. Scull, Jr., who died of a heart attack on Tuesday night, were held this afternoon and attended by scores of persons from public and professional life of the state, his patients and others whose undivided esteem he earned and held here and throughout the state.

The services were held in the Dover Presbyterian Church with the Rev. H. Newton Hudson, pastor, officiating. Interment was in Christ Churchyard.

Among the honorary pallbearers was Dr. Harry G. Neese, Jr., Wyoming, who was inadvertently omitted from the announced list.

Dr. Scull died at his residence, "Greenwald," 625 South State Street, a home built during the Civil War and acquired by him after returning from medical service in World War II.

Dr. Scull Dies In Dover at 47

President of Delaware Medical Society Victim Of Heart Attack at Home

DOVER, July 26.—Dr. Carl B. Scull, Jr., Dover physician, and president of the Delaware Medical Society, died of a heart attack last night at his home, 625 South State Street, at the age of 47.

Dr. Scull, formerly court-appointed Kent County physician, suffered a slight heart attack Monday night.

Dr. Scull was a native of Delaware, having been born at Wyoming, Nov. 4, 1902, a son of Carl B., Sr., and Rebecca Ennis Scull. He was a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania and its Medical School. He served a year's internship at Allegheny General Hospital, Pittsburgh, Pa.

He served with the Delaware National Guard during the years 1930-39, and with the Army from 1942 to 1946, participating in campaigns in Africa and Italy.

He was a member of the Kent County Draft Board in 1941, and again in 1948 and 1949. Active for some years in the Delaware Medical Society, he became its president last October, succeeding Dr. M. A. Tarumianz. He also held membership in the American Medical Association, and was a member of the Dover School Board and the Maple Dale Country Club. He was a Presbyterian and a Mason.

Dr. Scull is survived by his wife, the former Sara Karstetter whom he married in 1929, and two daughters, Rebecca Louise, 16, and Amelia Ann, 18. The latter, who entered Wheaton College at Norton, Mass., last fall, is at present touring Europe with a group of other students.

The deceased also leaves two sisters: Mrs. Carl E. Chatto, Wyoming, and Mrs. Louis Fitzgerald, Philadelphia.

Funeral arrangements are not complete.

Dr. Scull was the first president of the Delaware Medical Society to die in office since Dr. James Tilton, the first president of the organization, who died in 1822. Dr. Tilton served as president of the Medical Society from 1789 to 1822.
