January 7, 1955 – April 29, 2025

Sherry Kendall Larson-Reese, age 70, of Dover, Delaware, passed away peacefully on April 29, 2025, surrounded by her loving family. She was the devoted wife of Robert (Bob) Reese for 28 years and was previously married to the late Jeffery Larson, with whom she shared four children. Born in Cherry Hill, New Jersey, she was the daughter of David A. Kendall and Judith Sherry (née Kendall).

Growing up in Old Greenwich, CT, Sherry developed a love for adventure, history, reading and sailing. These passions shaped the way she navigated the joys and challenges of raising her four beautiful children. Just months after Jeffrey's passing, she courageously flew all four of them across the country for a grand lakeside skiing trip—an unforgettable act of strength and love. In Dover, Sherry built a foundational community for herself and her children. She worked for Capital School District in a variety of positions aimed at improving the lives of students and families.

Sherry was deeply committed to her community. Volunteering with the Boy Scouts of America, she was able to share her love for adventure and the outdoors while supporting important programming like summer camps and jamborees. A true life long learner, Sherry even earned her own Wood Badge. A devoted member of Christ Episcopal Church in Dover, she was active in church life and volunteered with Read Aloud Delaware, sharing her love of reading with children across the state. Sherry's adventurous spirit also took her all over the globe. She loved to travel and experienced many parts of the world during her life, including Russia, Iceland, and Alaska, as well as cruises she enjoyed with Bob and their close friends. After retiring, Sherry moved on to her most cherished role of all, the world's greatest Baba, a name she inherited from her own grandmother. Hosting joyful gatherings, providing the most incredible childcare, and planning weekend-long pool and boat adventures—there was no limit to what Baba would do for her beloved nine grandchildren. In her quiet time, she enjoyed baking, reading, sewing, musical theatre, and spending time near the water.

Sherry is survived by her loving husband of 28 years, Robert Reese, and by the four children she shared with Jeffrey Larson: Jessica Schemick (Andrew) of West Windsor, NJ; David Larson (Ashlene) of Severna Park, MD; Daniel Larson (Lynsey) of Philadelphia, PA; and Ben Larson (Sarah) of Bothell, WA.
